

New Law Creates Specialty License Plate

A new, specialty license plate is available for those who served in Operation Inherent Resolve. I authored the legislation that became **Act 36 of 2024** to create the plate.

Operation Inherent Resolve references the military campaign tasked with defeating Islamic State (commonly called ISIS or ISIL) terrorists in Syria, Iraq and Libya.

Applicants must submit a completed MV-150 form to the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation and provide a copy of the military's Form DD-214 noting service in Operation Inherent Resolve. There is a \$26 fee for most sizes of passenger vehicles. Contact one of my offices if you need assistance.

It is important to recognize the brave veterans who served in defense of American ideals during Operation Inherent Resolve.
